



Convention on the Mutual Recognition of Titles

The Bachelor and Master degrees issued in the CLUSTER universities satisfy the same high standards of quality and excellence and therefore can be considered as equivalent in academic level.

The rectors and presidents of the CLUSTER institutions have agreed on the following:

a). Students with a Bachelor degree from a CLUSTER university will be treated for admission to a Master's program in another CLUSTER institution in the same way as the local students of this institution.

b). Students with a Master degree from a CLUSTER university will be considered as eligible for application to a Ph.D. program in another CLUSTER institution with the same rules as the local students of this institution.

Convention on CLUSTER Dual Master Degree programmes









CLUSTER universities which have signed the convention agree to offer Dual Master Degree (MSc) programmes in Science and Engineering. A CLUSTER Dual Master Degree programme is a two year programme, comprising a minimum of 120 ECTS credits, offered jointly by two CLUSTER universities.

Regulations to qualify as a Cluster Dual Master Degree (MSc) programme;

The rectors/presidents of the CLUSTER institutions indicated below have agreed on the following:

- a) Each CLUSTER Dual Master Degree Programme must be approved by the participating institutions and by the Cluster Steering Committee.
- b) Applicants with a Bachelor degree or equivalent level of education from a CLUSTER university are eligible for a CLUSTER Dual Degree Programme.
- c) First years MSc students from a Cluster university are also eligible to apply to a CLUSTER Dual Degree Programme.
- d) Students successfully completing their studies of the Dual Master Degree programme obtain two MSc degrees, one by the home University and one by the host University. Students receive also a joint CLUSTER certificate signed by the two institutions representatives.
